Price and Payment

- Don't get pressured into signing a contract immediately. You should not be told that you need to sign a contract that day or risk a price increase.
- Paying a deposit of anywhere from 20 percent to 50

percent is typical; however, you should not be asked to pay the full cost in advance before work begins.

• Make sure you're comfortable • Check out the business on with the payment options. You should not be asked to pay cash to a salesperson instead of a check, money order or credit card.

References

- Confirm that the contractor has a verifiable mailing
- address for their business. • Check Labor & Industries (L&I), Washington State to ensure the business has no unresolved complaints.
- Ask the contractor to provide references for past work and be sure the references can be reached.
- consumer review sites such as HomeAdvisor, Houzz, etc. Remember to take the good with the bad when reading online reviews.

Contract and Completion

- Be cautious of anyone who tells you that "a contract won't be necessary." Insist on a complete and clearly written contract signed by you and the contractor.
- Ensure the final payment is

due once the job is completely finished and you are satisfied. Find out if any of the work requires city or county inspection, confirm that it is done and that you have paperwork proving it before making the final payment.
